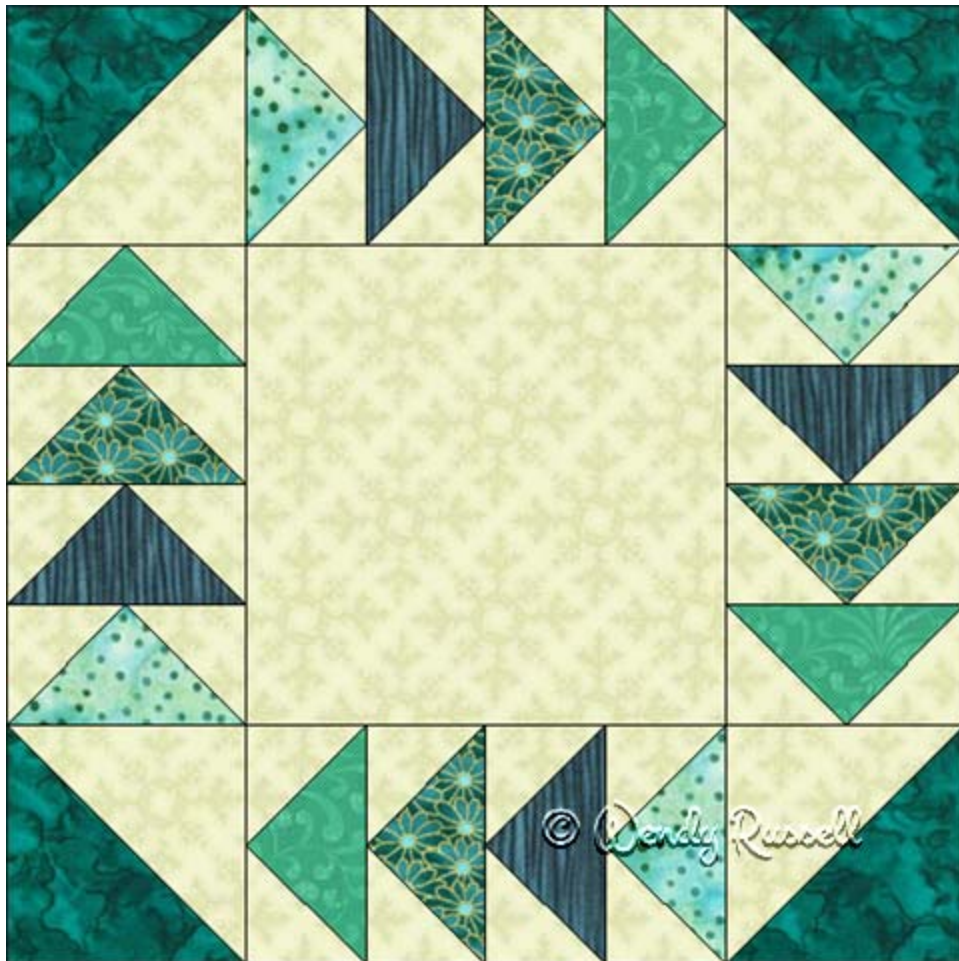

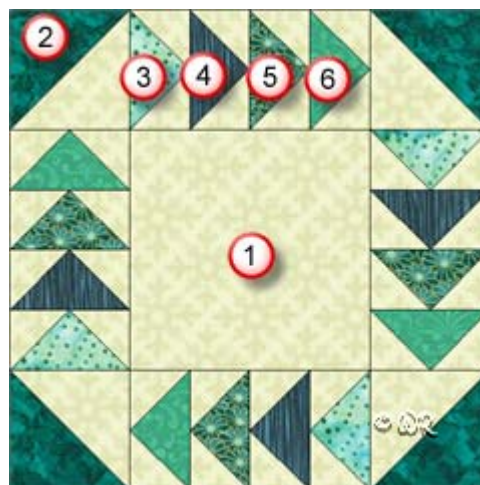

Fabric Placement



How-to Notes



Bisect square on one diagonal



Bisect square on both diagonals

Background fabric 1

Cut one square 6 1/2" for centre of block
Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" and bisect on one diagonal
Cut 16 squares 2 3/8" and bisect on one diagonal

Fabric 2 (for corner triangles)

Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" and bisect on one diagonal

Fabrics for Flying Geese units



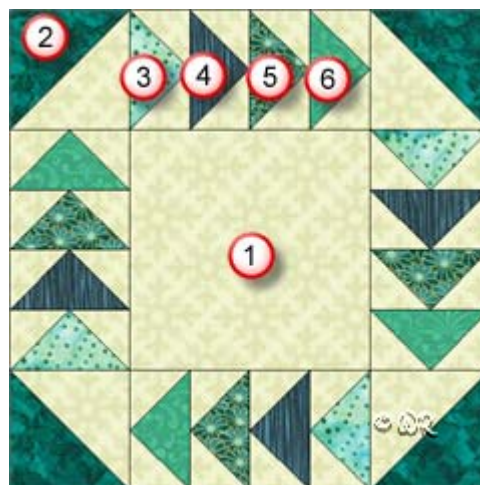
You can use one to four different fabrics for the flying geese units. For this example I will assume you are using 4 different fabrics.

For **each** different fabric, cut 1 square 4 1/4" and bisect on both diagonals, yielding 4 triangles of each fabric

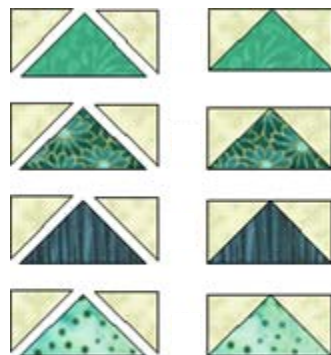
Fabrics for Flying Geese units



You can use one to four different fabrics for the flying geese units. For this example I will assume you are using 4 different fabrics.

For **each** different fabric, cut 1 square 3 1/4" and bisect on both diagonals, yielding 4 triangles of each fabric

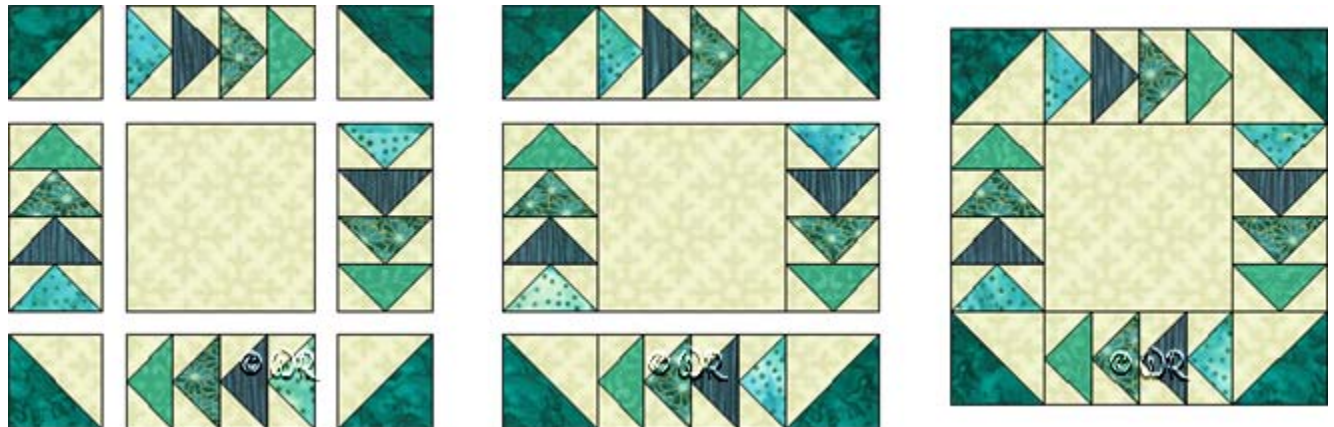
